Associate Pastor of Music & Ministries**

***“How Beautiful are the Feet of Those
Who Preach the Good News!”***

One of the great joys and privileges of the Christian life is participating in taking the gospel to the nations. When I was a child, missions seemed to be something only a select few did. It was very distant to me. But as I grew older and grew in my faith, the Lord began to show me that missions is an expectation for all believers. Matthew 28:18-20 is meant for all who declare “Jesus Is Lord” to obey, just like any other command in scripture.

Upon this revelation, I made a deal with God. I told Him that I would participate in an international mission trip my senior year of college. Every summer, several mission teams were sent out from my alma mater, The University of Mobile. I used the cost of these trips as an excuse not to participate (and the fear of being in a foreign culture), so naturally I chose the least expensive trip to Guatemala. I wrote letters to family and friends asking for prayer and financial support. Wouldn't you know it, I ended up receiving twice as much financial support as I needed for this mission trip and was able to help 2 others go.

God reminded me that day that nothing, even “the almighty dollar”, is too big for Him. What He calls you to, He will see you through. This initial trip sparked within me a passion for missions. As I write this article, I'm preparing to go on my 11th short term mission trip and 6th different country. Maybe you're like I was, coming up with excuses not to go. I challenge you to not only pray and give to missions but also, if physically able, to go. I've been overseas with people ranging in age from children to senior adults. Be apart of gospel missions. Pray, give, and go!



he gave the right to become children of God.**

A word from our Pastor

I want to share something with you that the Lord has opened my eyes to over these last few weeks as I was studying His Word. In the book of Lamentations, Jeremiah is lamenting the destruction of Jerusalem. This included not merely seeing the temple and the city destroyed, but also the people of God being murdered and carried away to Babylon in captivity.

The reality of what happened crushed Jeremiah. In Lamentations 3 he describes his emotions. He says in 3:7-8, "He has walled me about so that I cannot escape; he has made my chains heavy; though I call and cry for help, he shuts out my prayer." He also says that he is a man of affliction (v.1); is in darkness without any light (v. 2); has God's hand turned against him (v. 3); is besieged with bitterness and tribulation (v. 5); dwells in darkness (v. 6); is filled with bitterness (v.15); his soul is bereft of peace and has forgotten what happiness is (v.17); and has lost his endurance and hope (v. 18). He ends his lament in verse 20 by saying "his soul continually remembers his affliction. He can't stop thinking about his pain and despair. Jeremiah is truly a depressed and hopeless man; that is, until something changes.

In verse 21 he remembers something that brings him hope. "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. 'The Lord is my portion,' says my soul, 'therefore I will hope in him'" (vv. 22-24). Instead of dwelling on his circumstances, he begins to speak to himself. He reminds himself of the promises of God and who He is. His portion and refuge is not a change of circumstances but is God himself.

I have taught on this regularly in my ministry, but in reading through Lamentations, something new caught my eyes. It was at the end of Jeremiah's lament in 5:21. Jeremiah prays, "Restore us to yourself, O Lord, that we may be restored." The answer to Jeremiah being restored was not the Lord removing the hard circumstances. It wasn't giving his people an easy life. The answer to Jeremiah's soul being restored was the Lord giving Jeremiah more of Himself.

There is nothing greater and more valuable for your life and your family's life than having as much of Christ as possible. So as the new school year begins and we re-enter back into our lives of routines and structure, let's make sure that Christ is our priority. Let's prioritize getting more of Christ so that we can know Him more. That is more important for your life and your child's life than anything else. I love you, Camellia, and I am grateful for you!
